Email your entries to the show secretary at by 8:00 PM on Thursday, September 15, 2022. *Preregistration requires no prepayment or obligation to show.* All entries received after 8:00 PM THURSDAY before the show will be charged a late fee of \$50.00 in addition to all other fees.

Membership Requirements: All exhibitors must be current members of the Texas Schooling Show Association. Memberships are \$20.00 for individuals and \$25.00 for families and may be paid at the show.

Payment: Bring a blank check to the show. DO NOT fill out the check before you arrive. Credit cards and cash are not accepted.

Prizes: Trophies and ribbons will be awarded in all classes. Championship trophy and ribbon and reserve ribbon will be awarded in each division in accordance with USEF Rule XXIV. Chapter VII.

Attire: Appropriate attire required. Coats are optional for English classes. Approved helmets must be worn by ALL English riders while mounted—includes warmup ring. Numbers must be worn and be clearly visible.

Directions From Austin: Take Hwy 290 east through Elgin to Roy Davis Road. Turn left on to Roy Davis Road (first left after the traffic light at Hwy 290 and Hwy 95 south). At stop sign take a right on to Old McDade Road. Cross over the RR tracks and turn left on to Norwood Lane. Follow Norwood Lane until it dead ends and take the left-hand farm entrance into Bit By Bit Farms.

VERSATILITY WILL SHOW IN THE FIELD

1. LEADLINE Open to very, very beginner riders.

45. RING 1 ALL DAY HUNTER SCHOOLING

Fences at height of current division showing . This class to remain open through last class of Ring 1. No TSSA points.

46. RING 2 ALL DAY HUNTER SCHOOLING

Fences at height of current division showing . This class to remain open through last class of Ring 2. No TSSA points.

CROSS RAIL HUNTER DIVISION Fences 18"

Open to all beginners. The course may be trotted or cantered. A horse may be ridden by more than one rider and each rider/horse combination receives championship points and year end points.

RIDERS MAY ONLY CROSS ENTER INTO 2' VERTICAL HUNTER OR 2' VERTICAL EQUITATION DIVISIONS.

CROSS RAIL EQUITATION DIVISION Fences 18"

Open to all beginners. The course may be trotted or cantered. A horse may be ridden by more than one rider and each rider/horse combination receives championship points and year end points. **RIDERS MAY ONLY CROSS ENTER INTO 2' VERTICAL HUNTER OR 2' VERTICAL EQUITATION DIVISIONS.**

2' VERTICAL HUNTER DIVISION

Open to all beginners. The course will be made up of simple fences without a change of direction. Riders in this division who are also entered in any cross rail hunter or cross rail equitation classes ARE NOT eligible for any other TSSA division. Riders in this division who are not entered in any cross rail classes MAY cross enter ONLY into the 2' Hunter and 2' Equitation divisions.

Riders in this division who are not entered in any cross rail classes MAY cross enter ONLY into the 2' Hunter and 2' Equitation divisions.

NEW FOR 2022 – WESTERN, RANCH, & HUNT SEAT VERSATILITY

Western/Ranch Attire

Riders wear a western hat or helmet, button-up collared shirt, and western boots, lace-up ropers or paddock boots. Any boot other than a leather sole boot is strongly discouraged. Spurs and chaps are optional. Clothing should be neat and clean.

Western/Ranch Equipment

Horses are shown in a stock saddle that fits the rider. Silver equipment will not count over good, clean, working equipment. Horses may be ridden with a curb, spade, or half-breed bit. Split reins must be used and held in one hand with no more than one finger between the reins. When using a romal, no fingers between the reins are allowed.

WESTERN DIVISION

45. Walk/Jog Western Pleasure

Horses are shown in a group, judged on manners and suitability for a relaxed and slow but collected gait cadence, and a calm and responsive disposition. The horse is to appear to be a "pleasure" to ride. Gates are walk and jog. Horses are expected to stand quietly and back readily.

46. Western Pleasure

Horses are shown in a group, judged on manners and suitability for a relaxed and slow but collected gait cadence, and a calm and responsive disposition. The horse is to appear to be a "pleasure" to ride. Gates are walk, jog, and lope. Horses are expected to stand quietly and back readily.

47. Western Horsemanship

Riders show individually, judged on their ability to execute a pattern with precision and smoothness while exhibiting poise and confidence and maintaining a correct body position.

48. Western Trail

Horses are shown individually and judged on their ability to navigate a series of obstacles. Gates are walk, jog, and lope.

RANCH DIVISION

49. Walk/Trot Ranch Rail

Horses are shown in a group, judged on the more natural and forward gaits commonly used in ranch work. This class encourages a natural headset. The extended walk and trot may be called for. Horses will be expected to stand quietly and back readily.

50. Ranch Rail

Horses are shown in a group, judged on the more natural and forward gaits commonly used in ranch work. This class encourages a natural headset. The extended walk, trot, and canter may be called for. Horses will be expected to stand quietly and back readily.

51. Ranch Horsemanship

Riders show individually, judged on their performance of a pattern that includes changes of gait, extension of gait, crossing legs, and lead changes.

52. Ranch Trail

Horses are shown individually, judged on their willingness to perform tasks that might be asked of during a normal workday on the ranch. This class consists of obstacles and walk, trot, and lope.

53. HUNT SEAT VERSATILITY CLASS – ENGLISH TACK

Horses are shown individually in English tack. Judged on ability to navigate a series of obstacles. Gates are walk, trot, and canter.
